Conflict-Free Minerals Declaration

Several metals commonly used in the electronics industry: gold (Au), tantalum (Ta), tungsten (W) and tin (Sn) have a variety of sources, including what has been termed as a "Conflict Region". Most recently, the eastern region of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) has been determined to be a "Conflict Region".

In light of this, Wasco will undertake reasonable due diligence within our supply chain to assure that gold (Au), tantalum (Ta), tungsten (W) and tin (Sn) are not procured as a "Conflict Metal." A "Conflict Metal" is a metal derived from ore sourced from mines in conflict areas of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), or illegally taxed on trade routes, either of which are controlled by non-government military groups, or unlawful military factions. Trade routes not confirmed to be "Conflict Free" include direct exports from the DRC, as well as exports through Rwanda, Uganda, Burundi, Tanzania and Kenya (countries of whom the U.N. Security Council note are global export routes for DRC-mined minerals).
